The 2001 SCCA SEDiv Solo2 Championship Series Rookie Program

The intent of the SEDiv Solo2 Rookie Program is to promote and foster new participation for first-year divisional competitors. Participation is only open to competitors who have never participated in a previous year Divisional Solo2 event. Rookie Program competitors will be grouped and scored using this year's PAX multiplication factors to normalize the results as follows:

STOCK & STREET TOURING-S

SS: 0.830, AS: 0.817, BS: 0.813, CS: 0.804, DS: 0.796, ES: 0.786, FS: 0.807, GS: 0.789, HS: 0.789, STS: 0.782

STREET PREPARED & STREET TOURING-R

ASP: 0.852, BSP: 0.847, CSP: 0.844, DSP: 0.819, ESP: 0.822, FSP: 0.815, STR: 0.809

PREPARED & STREET MOD

AP: 0.874, BP: 0.872, CP: 0.856, DP: 0.853, EP: 0.873, FP: 0.865, SM: 0.842

MODIFIED & KART

AM: 1.000, BM: 0.955, CM: 0.924, DM: 0.900 EM: 0.907, FM: 0.904, F125: 0.946

A rookie competitor's lowest timed run from Saturday & Sunday of each event will be combined and multiplied by the appropriate class PAX number to determine the final finishing positions for the EEC Rookie competition. Event trophies and championship series points will be awarded for the rookie competition the same as in regular SEDiv Solo2 Championship Series class competition. A Year-End Rookie Championship will be awarded to the rookie with the largest accumulation of series points for each competition classing category. As in normal SEDiv competition, points will be accumulated from the best 2 of 3 SEDiv Solo2 events held this year. However, to qualify for the Year-End Rookie Championship award a rookie must compete in a minimum of (2) two SEDiv Solo2 Series events in the same competition category. The rookie can change cars or classes and still be eligible for the EEC Year-End Rookie Championship. Rookies are also eligible to simultaneously win their respective SEDiv competition class for each event and Year-End SEDiv Class Championship points series as well.
